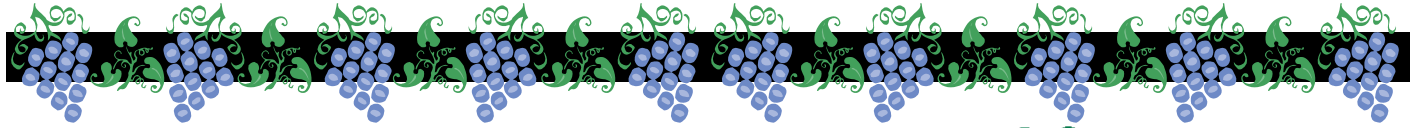

Ring Joust Tournament Added to the Warren County Farmers' Fair

**On Wednesday night August 4th the Farmers Fair will
host an Open 4-H/FFA Ring Joust for youth and
adults!**

Jousting today is no longer just a pastime for nobles. It is a popular activity for 4-Hers in Maryland! Classes are based on skill level, without regard to gender or age, making this an ideal sport for any backyard horse enthusiast or family. Tournaments are usually divided into four classes; Novice, Amateur, Semi-Professional and Professional. The object is to gallop (or walk as the case may be) your horse down a track and try to spear small rings with the use of a lance (provided). Tournaments have few rules other than scoring. Riders can ride any type of horse.



Psst.... Experienced jousters say that a level-headed, mid-size to small horse with an extremely smooth canter works best.
